Throw away old bottles and cans

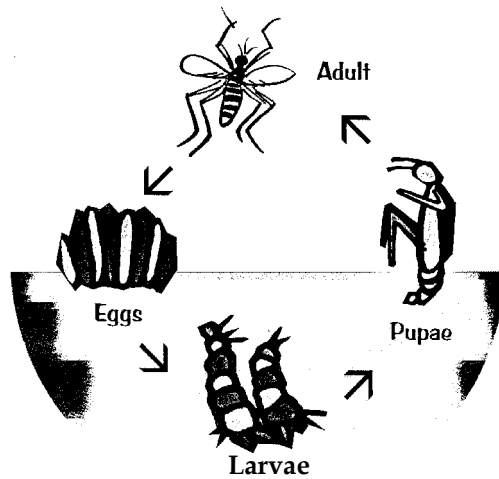


Clean overgrown ponds and stock with fish



Clean leaf-clogged gutters

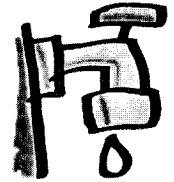
Mosquito Life Cycle



It takes about one week for a mosquito to grow from egg to adult



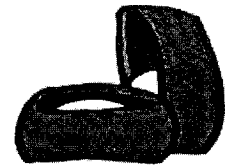
Empty water from flower pot dishes



Repair Leaky Faucets



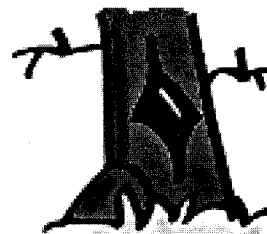
Screen or cover rain barrels
